# What is Heroin?

Heroin is a very addictive drug and heroin addiction is an increasingly serious problem in our area. Heroin is processed from morphine and usually appears as a white or brown powder. Street names include "Smack," "H," "Skag" and "Junk." Other names may refer to types of heroin such as "Mexican Black Tar" or "Brainstorm."

Recent studies suggest a shift from injecting heroin to snorting or smoking because of the increased purity of the drug and the myth that these ingestion methods are safer.

# What are Opioids?

Opioids are drugs used to relieve pain:
hydrocodone (Vicoden, Percocet), Codeine,
Oxycontin and related drugs. They are
usually prescribed by health professionals.
When abused, even a single dose can cause
overdose and death. Regular or long term
use can lead to physical dependency and
addiction. Prescription opioid addiction can
lead to heroin addiction because heroin is
often cheaper and easier to obtain.
